
Video two, on right: projection, 1'00" continuously on play. Color, sound.

This work reflects experiences and challenges that almost any woman faces everyday as she tries to balance her personal and professional life in an almost unbearable rhythm, trying to fulfill a never-ending list of duties.

The videos I have created explore the repetitive nature of everyday activities often associated with a woman's domestic life in a suburban environment. Conceived as a video installation, this work is realized via two projected videos which stand side by side of each other and five monitors which run in an endless loop. I have In the first video is filmed myself while visibly pregnant, walking through a seemingly quiet and peaceful domestic environment which gets disrupted by the breaking of dishes, cups and silverware as they get thrown off the table in revolt-like way against this neverending routine. The second projection contains three repetitive round motions, associated also with every day like chores.





The work reflects experiences and challenges that every woman faces every day when trying to balance her personal and professional life. The pressure to fulfill a neverending list of "duties" and expectations that society has towards women. In this video is filmed myself while visibly pregnant, walking through a seemingly quiet and peaceful domestic environment which gets disrupted by the breaking of dishes, cups and silverware as they get thrown off the table in revolt-like way against this never-ending routine. Is originally a video installation of two projected videos which stand side by side and five monitors that run in an endless loop. It was built to be experiences from a further distance then the one we see right here. So here I am working towards simplifying the message for a very close more personal point of view. The essence of the work is at the center of attention and you can find the original materials used on the video such as the table cloth etc., somehow come to life at the bottom of the work as if to remind us that even though the work seems to depict a quiet and peaceful domestic environment somehow a revolt that can break things easily is on the other side of the balance.




Propaganda

This video installation is based on childhood memories, playing with the most popular fortune teller toy for children in Albania, during the communist era. So much wasted paper, time and lives.








Departure
